CALL TO ORDER AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

President Allen called the meeting to order at 9:07 a.m. and asked Second Vice President Jenny

Crosswhite, Santa Paula, RC District 47, to lead the pledge of allegiance.

PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

ACTION ITEM

1. 2026 SCAG Scholarship Program

Jan Harnik, Scholarship Committee Chair, reported on the 2026 scholarship program, noting a record 292 applications received, of which 183 met minimum requirements. She noted that the committee reviewed and evaluated the top 50 applications based on students' essays, career goals, letters of recommendation, and extracurricular activities, ultimately recommending 11 students for awards. She shared that the selected recipients represent diverse backgrounds and geographic distribution across the SCAG region, including Imperial, Los Angeles, Ventura, Orange, Riverside, and San Bernardino counties. She also explained that SCAG funds nine scholarships, with two additional awards supported by the California Transportation Foundation. Chair Harnik expressed appreciation to the Foundation, committee members, and academic representatives for their contributions to a rigorous and inspiring selection process and concluded by requesting Board approval of the recommended scholarship recipients.

2. Connect SoCal 2050: Special Subcommittee

Sarah Jepson, Planning Director, provided an update on the Connect SoCal 2050 plan, which the Board is expected to consider for adoption within two years to refine the region's vision for improved mobility and sustainable development. She reported that over the past two years, staff have compiled and analyzed data to track progress toward regional goals and identify emerging trends to inform policy discussions. She noted that at the recent Joint Policy Committee (JPC) meeting, staff presented highlights on existing regional conditions, available in the State of the Region report, and shared insights from the preliminary growth forecast. She indicated that the JPC also recommended that the Regional Council approve the formation of a special committee to provide overarching policy leadership for the plan's development, consisting of at least two members from each of the three policy committees and up to three ex-officio members. She explained that the committee's primary responsibility would be to recommend performance metrics to align strategies with the regional vision and to advance recommendations on draft and final policies and implementation strategies. She noted that the committee was expected to convene in summer and meet approximately six to eight times over an 18-month period, concluding in winter 2028. She emphasized that the vision and strategies that were established in Connect SoCal drive all of the work at Skag, including the transportation projects they fund in the FTIP, and through various federal and state funding programs. She also stated that it sets the priorities for their state and federal advocacy work, and it informs the Regional Housing Needs Assessment with implications for local land use planning.

There were no public comments on Item No. 2.

3. 2028 Games Regional Transportation Demand Management (TDM) Approach

Sarah Jepson, Planning Director, reported on progress made over the past year under President Allen's leadership to prepare the region for the 2028 Olympic and Paralympic Games, including adoption of the Games Program Development Framework to guide SCAG's efforts and participation in the Games Mobility Executive Committee. She noted that SCAG hosted convenings on economic impacts, supported cities through a resource guide, and prioritized transportation demand management (TDM) projects in federal funding decisions. She reminded the Board that the Regional Council approved the Community Hubs program to assist up to 12 cities in creating celebration spaces, as well as a quick-build program to enhance walkability and public spaces in anticipation of increased active transportation. She indicated that staff requested approval of the Transportation Committee's recommendation to adopt the 2028 Games Regional TDM Approach and authorize the Executive Director to program resources and pursue additional funding. She noted that the approach seeks to achieve a 15% reduction in background travel to maintain system performance and minimize congestion impacts, with implementation involving multiple agencies and local jurisdictions. She explained that SCAG's role will focus on regional communications, wayfinding, supplemental mobility programs, and supportive regulatory and operational policies, including parking, transportation network company, and freight strategies. Lastly, she stated staff would continue refining the approach and return in July with a comprehensive TDM Strategic Plan.

BUSINESS REPORT

Regional Council Member Lucy Dunn stated her report was on page 142. She expressed she was honored to chair the Global Land Use and Economics Council. She indicated they received a briefing of what the Joint Policy Committees heard. She shared that she thought it was particularly fascinating that with the median age rising, plus population growth being flat, smaller households, and a housing shortage, it would be good for builders to hear this information because they may need to work on designing new product types.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

President Allen recognized outgoing Regional Council and Policy Committee members, expressing appreciation for their contributions and service to SCAG and the region. She also provided a recap of three recent mobile tours, including a visit to the Port of Los Angeles highlighting regional infrastructure, trade, and sustainability efforts; a tour of the OCVIBE mixed-use development in Anaheim, which will include housing, parks, and commercial space; and a tour of the CV Link multi-use path in the Coachella Valley, demonstrating regional collaboration in active transportation and sustainable infrastructure, along with a visit to Aziz Farms to learn about sustainable agriculture. She expressed appreciation to SunLine Transit and its leadership for supporting the Coachella Valley tour and showcasing clean transportation technologies. Lastly, she stated the next Regional Council meeting was June 4 at 11:45 a.m. at the SCAG main office in Downtown Los Angeles.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Executive Director Kome Ajise recognized Honorable Lucy Dunn for her service as Business Representative, commending her leadership and valuable perspective on business-related policy matters. He provided an update on the federal recertification process, noting that SCAG undergoes a review every four years by the Federal Highway Administration and Federal Transit Administration to maintain its designation as a Metropolitan Planning Organization. He indicated that as part of this process, meetings with federal representatives were scheduled, and a public comment period would be held from May 1 through June 15, 2026, with submission details to be posted on the SCAG website and newsletter. He also announced the upcoming formation of two subcommittees: the Connect SoCal 2050 Subcommittee and the RHNA Subcommittee, with member appointments to be made during the summer EAC retreat and interest to be solicited by the Clerk. He noted that the RHNA



Subcommittee structure would be presented for approval in June. He also provided legislative updates on SCAG-sponsored bills SB 1087, aimed at modernizing Sustainable Communities Strategy requirements, and AB 2002, which would establish ongoing funding for housing programs, both of which were progressing through the State Legislature. Lastly, he announced the departure of Chief Information Officer Julie Shoyer effective May 15, acknowledging her significant contributions to modernizing SCAG's technology systems and strengthening cybersecurity, and noted that a transition plan was underway.

There were no public comments on the Business, President's or Executive Director's reports.
